Still today they hand craft Frankoma's classic designs as well as beautiful new patterns and colors. It takes as many as eight artisans to create and finish a single piece so each item is truly unique.

Frank Home - Hidden Treasure Revealed: The Frank sisters open their family home to lovers of art and architecture. For over 50 years, the Frank family home has nestled into a wooded hillside in Sapulpa, flowing into its natural setting just as its owner and architect envisioned. Not just any house, it was designed with the attention to detail that only an artist could



create — and in this case, the artist was a potter. Together with renowned architect Bruce Goff, a protégé of Frank Lloyd Wright, the Frank family was able to create a home for themselves that brought nature inside and their living space out into nature.
