Upon arrival we will visit the Craft Village which offers over 20 homespun craft demonstrations you can see, touch and enjoy. The Ozark Folk Center is a wonderful way to enjoy yesterday. Arkansas' unique Ozark Folk Center State Park is America's only facility that works at preserving the Ozark heritage and presenting it in such an entertaining way. Tap your toes to mountain music, see blacksmithing, pottery-making and over 18 other pioneer skills and crafts. You can learn to play the dulcimer or autoharp, to jig dance or to grow an organic herb garden. You can view all the shops and then on Saturday morning take a craft class and have a keepsake to bring home.



SHOWTIME:

At the Ozark Folk Center

Our visit will include dinner at the Skillet Restaurant and a music show that promises us the chance to tap our toes and clap our hands to the pickin' and singin'. This is the original "unplugged" authentic

mountain music. The songs of the south and the folk dance tunes of the region provide a looking glass offering a treasured glimpse of history of American folk music in Arkansas. The fiddle and banjo were favorite sources of entertainment for pioneer settlers, and these two popular American folk instruments still sing out among the sounds one hears today when visiting the beautiful Ozarks. Guitars, mandolins, dulcimers, autoharps and other acoustic instruments join to create the old-time music that is still enjoyed to this very day in scenic Mountain View, the heart of the Ozark folk music scene.

We will step back in time on Saturday morning. After a full breakfast (included), we will head to one of the several craft workshops we have planned. You might want to make a Cornhusk Angel or a Stained Glass Ornament, there are several classes to pick from (see the back page for choices). 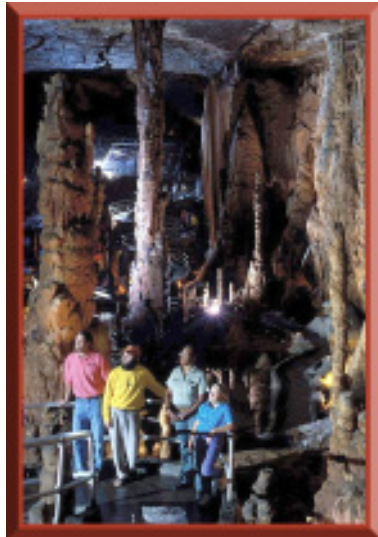
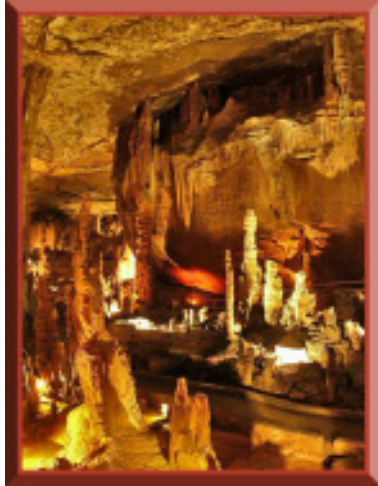
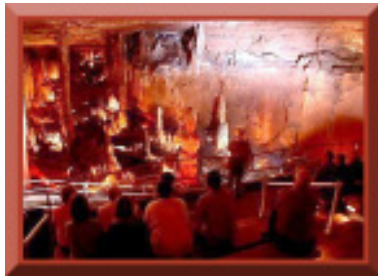

After our craft class we will head back over to the Skillet Restaurant before we depart the Ozark Folk Center. This afternoon you have two options to choose from: **OPTION 1:** Tour the “Folk Music Capital of the World”, downtown Mountain View, Arkansas and browse the stores for collectibles and arts and crafts. Everyone that stays in town will also receive a single dip sundae at the ice cream store located on the square. **OPTION 2:** Blanchard Springs Caverns. The Caverns are breathtaking from the moment you first walk in. A 200-foot elevator ride leaves you truly in another world - one created more than 300 million years ago. Blanchard Springs Caverns is the jewel in the Ozark National Forest Crown. Dubbed by Life Magazine as “one of the most extraordinary finds of the century”, this living cave is constantly in the process of formation. Two paved, lighted trails, one of which is handicapped accessible with assistance, are open to visitors of all ages. Led by knowledgeable Forest Service Guides, the tour winds through water-carved passages, including an underground river and the world’s largest flowstone. Visitors are guided within feet of living cave formations. *Handicap accessible.*

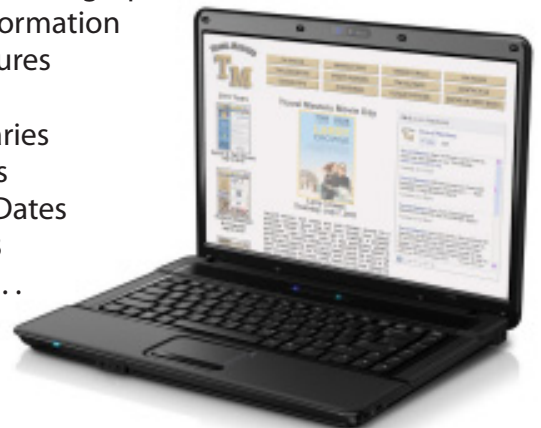

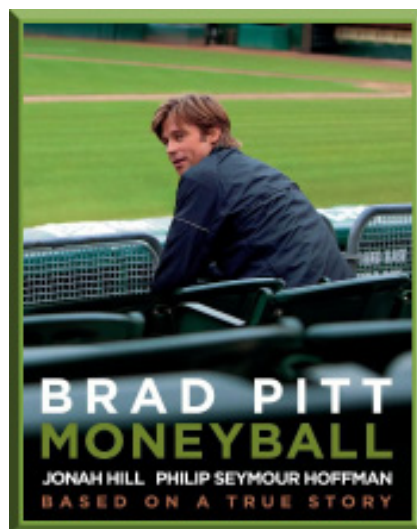

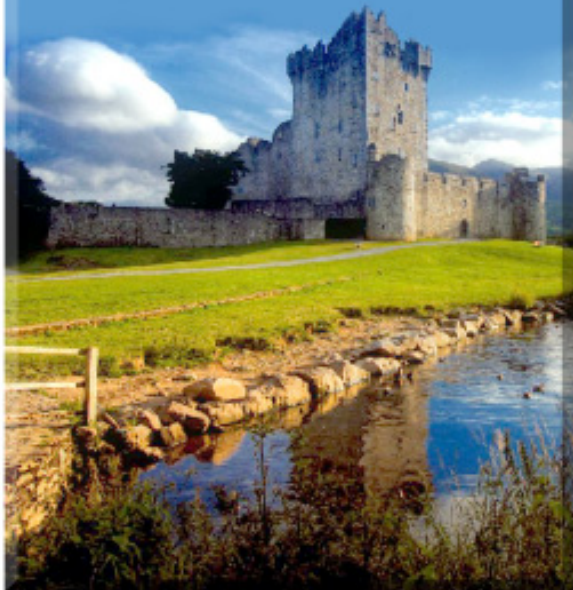
